2022 - The Year in Review

We are starting a brand-new year here at the EI Paso Northeast SDA Church and it behooves us to take a look back to see how we got to where we are today. I am going to blaze through 2020, and 2021 with some interesting information so hang on and enjoy the ride.

The year 2020 was, basically, a lost year. In March Covid hit and we closed the doors for over five months before we had a tentative live worship service again. As a result, when we did reopen, our attendance was very low, averaging 15 to 20 people each Sabbath. Due to Covid, church officers and ministry Directors were asked to extend their tenure through the end of January and the new list did not go into effect until 1 January of 2021. This has now become the beginning of our new calendar as well as fiscal year.

2021 was a year of slow recovery. Attendance was almost at its normal 40 to 50 people by the end of the year and Adventist Giving, available on our church website began to really take off. Over 80% of tithes and offerings were made online in 2021. Ministries began to have live functions as masking requirements were relaxed, and experienced

some very good participation as the year closed. We began to make phenomenal strides in paying down the church mortgage in 2021 and the projection is that we might be able to have it paid off by the end of 2023. Praise God!

2022 was a banner year for God's church in the Northeast. Attendance has increased, we saw multiple baptisms as people gave themselves to the Lord, offerings from our online giving link at the church's website increased by almost 15% over 2021 and, for the first time, we sponsored a one-weeklong church trip for 46 people to The Creation Museum and the Ark Encounter in Kentucky.

In 2022 we paid down our mortgage by over \$34,500 and have a good shot at paying it off completely in 2023 as we had projected in 2021.

A new group of Ministry Directors and a new Board were elected in November, and they have hit the ground running.

Moving into **2023** our January services saw the pews filled most of the time, and you could feel the air of God's love pouring out.

Co-Social Committee Vicki Murray Louise Grosse Church Board meetings are normally held on the second Sunday of each month at 10 a.m. and are usually done via Zoom. If you have something you would like to bring to the Board's attention, please speak to the ministry director of the ministry involved and that director will contact Milo Knight, the Church Clerk to ask him to add you to the agenda for the following Board meeting.

There is, in addition to the Church Board of Directors, the Finance Committee which reviews church finances, budget, funding requests, projects requiring church funding and priorities of spending. The Finance Committee meets once a quarter and makes recommendations to the Board based on their findings. In many cases the Board will approve or disapprove actions but some may be required to be recommended to a full business meeting of the church as a whole for a final decision.

All members of the El Paso Northeast SDA Church are able to vote at Business Meetings and it is strongly encouraged that if you are a member of this church you attend the business meetings. It is desirable that a majority of the church membership makes these decisions, not just a handful. Many times these decisions can have long-term and important effects on the church. You don't want a small number of people making these big decisions. All business meetings will be announced at least two consecutive weeks in advance of the meeting.

News From the Treasury

The \$37,200 church budget for FY 2022 was met with a surplus of \$2,994.63. This was based on a monthly budget of \$3,000 for expenses and \$100 to savings each month. A deep thanks to God for his blessings last year to our church is appropriate.

The church's Budget for FY 2023 was increased to \$3,500 per month at the Church

Business Meeting in November. This was to accommodate the \$487 voluntary support offering to the Academy each month.

The church mortgage balance went from a high of \$85,432.90 on January 1st, 2022, to a low of \$50,886.29 at the end of December. That means we paid off \$34,546.61 in 2022. Praise God!

IN MY DARKEST DAYS YOU WERE THERE

Sabbath, July 2nd, 2022, dawned bright and sunny. It was a perfectly lovely summer morning. As usual, just as we did every sabbath, Bryan and I woke up, ate breakfast and got ready for the day's activities. In sabbath school, Ellen led out in the lesson study. On this occasion, she asked us to share our favorite bible text and why. As I think back now, I can't recall what anyone else said, my mind goes blank. My verse, I remember, was Isaiah 41:10 "Fear thou not for I am with thee, be not dismayed, for I am thy God. I will strengthen thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness". It was my mother's favorite verse. She had claimed it for herself numerous times throughout her life and those words had brought comfort and hope to me as well up until that time. This Sabbath seemed like nothing out of the ordinary. Pastor Eliab blessed the congregation with an inspiring message. After church, Bryan and I enjoyed a picnic lunch at home in the shade of our trees. It was beautiful and peaceful. In just a few short hours my entire world was about to be turned upside down and inside out like never before.

It was 6 O'clock AM, Sunday, July 3rd, 2022, when a loud knock at my door awakened me. A sheriff and three police stood there. They asked me to come outside with them where we could talk. I was exhausted, terrified, confused and angry all at the same time. They asked me a thousand questions and told me they were looking for Bryan. Later that same morning they came back to inform me that my husband was deceased. My world crumbled beneath me in that instant.

To this day, I still don't have any explanations for why it happened. What I do know though, is the terribly dark and frightening place I suddenly found myself in. At that moment, I stood there alone and cried out to God for help! I was in a perpetual state of shock, and I felt terrified facing the fact that my worst nightmare had suddenly become my reality! Joshua 1:9 came to mind. "Do not be afraid, do not be discouraged, for the Lord God will be

with you wherever you go". Within hours, I was surrounded not only by my grown children and Bryan's parents, but also my closest friends (my church family) at El Paso Northeast SDA Church. I will forever be grateful for all of you!

The days and weeks that followed were not easy. People would ask me what I needed but it was difficult for me to make requests because I was so overwhelmed with everything I had to do. If you've never had this kind of loss, you can't understand the feelings of complete despair. You (my church family) were and still are direct answers to my prayers. You showered my family with your prayers. You wrapped your arms of love us and we all felt the warmth of your Christian love and kindness.

My father-in-law and all three of my children have remarked many times about your genuine acts of love towards us during our time of grief. We received numerous visits from Pastor House & Becky and Pastor Eliab. Pastor Eliab dedicated a church service for the memory of Bryan. You, as my church family, provided and delivered delicious hot meals for us. You took the time to write and send notes filled with many bible verses and words of heartwarming encouragement. I have kept them and read them often. Women's Ministry provided a way for me to attend the Retreat in Albuquerque last October. (Transportation included). It was a beautiful time of friendship and healing. Finally, you saw a need and provided a way for my front deck and ramp to be rebuilt. Pastor Eliab asked the 'right man' to do the job. A man named Steven Weaver. (He's truly my own blessing from God and a whole new chapter in my life).

My Dearest Northeast Church Family, I love you for who you are and for all you have done for my family and me. You have blessed us by your actions, and I am so grateful for every one of you. I will never be able to repay you for all your kindness and love. Perhaps, I will be able to pay it forward someday. You were all there on my darkest days and helped me get back up on my feet. With all my heart I say, thank you!
